Prime Minister Ramsay MacDonald announced the Communal Award:

1. Separate electorate for all minorities of India.2. Weightage to minorities3. No Muslim majorities in Punjab and Bengalas was followed in Lucknow Pact4. One third representation for Muslims in Central legislature5. One fourth representation for Muslims in services6. Sind to be made a province

Question 6: Write a short note on The Quit India Movement 1942?

Answer:

The Quit India Movement (Bharat Chhodo Andolan or the August Movement) was a civil disobedience movement launched in India in August 1942 in response to Mohandas Gandhi's call for immediate independence. Gandhi hoped to bring the British government to the negotiating table. Almost the entire Indian National Congress leadership, and not just at the national level, was put into confinement less than twenty-four hours after Gandhi's speech, and the greater number of the Congress leaders were to spend the rest of World War II in jail.

Question 7: Write a very brief note on Land Reforms in Pakistan?

Land Reforms are introduced from time to time by different governments: in 1959, 1972, and 1977. The aim was to reduce land holding and to strengthen the position of tenants. It was done for improving yield per acre and poverty alleviation in agriculture field.
